Recently member **Alan Harwood** gave a talk about the Fossil shortline railroad depot near Kemmerer, which is currently being renovated. **Carol Harwood** gave an update on the 100th anniversary of the Frontier #1 mine explosion that occurred on August 14, 1923, killing 99 miners. The chapter is working to install a sign near Kemmerer commemorating this disaster. On a sad note the chapter reported the loss of **Donna Oden** and said, "She and **Dennis** were the foundation of our chapter. Their enthusiasm and efforts have resulted in a participation, enjoyment and love of our local history by the community."

Lola left us a wonderful financial gift that allows us to sponsor a research grant program in her name, and support the Society. Throughout the years more people have stepped in to fill their shoes and work hard to make sure that the Society's vision continues. The Wyoming Historical Foundation was formed in 1963 as the fundraising arm of the Society and through a variety of special projects over the years has been very successful in establishing a long-term endowment administered by the Wyoming Community Foundation. Join us for the celebration in Cody the weekend of September 8th, hosted by the **Park County Historical Society**. The Executive Committee will meet Friday, September 8th with the general membership meeting on Saturday, September 9th. There will be food, fun, and wonderful places to visit.

The **Wyoming State Museum** recently installed "Sioux Ledger Drawings & Artifacts: A Cultural Heritage," comprised of thirty-six color drawings reproduced from a ledger book dated 1891. "Artifact: A Cultural Heritage," features images by photographer Mike McClure highlighting three regions of Wyoming. The Society recently received a grant from the **Wyoming Cultural Trust Fund** in the amount of \$3,000 for its "Women of Wyoming" social history project. Chaired by WHS member **Janelle Molony**, the grant will be used to enhance current and future interviews with and about Wyoming women, both living and historical. The content will be available on the Society's website and YouTube account. A final collection of twenty interviews is anticipated.

The **Wyoming Humanities Council** has awarded a \$10,000 Crossroads Grant to the Society to launch a video series to accompany articles featured on WyoHistory.org. **Kylie McCormick**, WHS member said videos will start coming out this fall on the Society's official YouTube page.

Steve Cotherman, WHS member, artist and museum, recently exhibited his work at the Washburn (Wisconsin) Cultural Center, where he is the director. Formerly Steve worked as the Curator of Art for the Wyoming State Museum, and later as its director.

Staff of the **Jim Gatchell Memorial Museum** were recent guests of the White House where they received official recognition of the museum's prestigious award from the Institute of Museum and Library Services. The Bylaw Committee, consisting of **Sandy Holyoak, Richard Knight, and Rick Robbins** will recommend several minor changes to the current Bylaws for consideration by the general membership at the Annual Meeting in Cody the weekend of September 8th.

Sandy said that the changes are primarily housekeeping, i.e. changing references to Executive Secretary to Executive Director; removing the word “Constitution” throughout; and punctuation, all of which will improve readability.

The Bylaws are important to the Society and Chapters, and provide guidance as to how all entities should perform. Updates are generally made on an annual basis, and always require a majority vote to amend.

Also, you’ll note this issue includes a ballot for new members to the Executive Committee. There are two At-Large seats open with four people running, and one Out of State seat open with one person running. Thank you to all for tossing your hat in the ring.

SAY GOODBYE TO LINDA FABIAN... ...AND WELCOME TO ALEY PHILP



Linda first became acquainted with the Society in 1980 when she started working for what was then the Archives, Museums & Historical Department in Cheyenne. During her almost 20 years with that state agency she served as Chief Public Information Officer and Co-State History Day Coordinator.

She often said that's where her higher education for all things Wyoming began. From 1997 to 2004 she served on the Society's Executive Committee as secretary and later president.

After leaving state government in 2000, she began a job as director of Wheatland Economic Development, a position she held until 2007 when the Society hired her as Executive Director. As the Society's first and only full-time employee she saw a lot of growth in the accomplishments of the Society's mission. "It has been my privilege to work with members from across Wyoming and the United States, chapter leadership, and so many of our partners," she said. "I have been truly blessed by your support and friendship all these years." She added, "I have been honored by people from all walks of life, and can't begin to thank each and every one of you. Your personal notes, pictures of your families and pets, cards, candy, and so much more have enhanced my life over the years.

Working for the Society gave me many opportunities including co-authoring three books, developing policies and programs, and so much more." She added that the Society supported her personal growth, and saw her through the deaths of her sister, mom and husband. "I am not disappearing and look forward to continuing my service to the Society by volunteering to be on a couple of committees, and maybe even an appointment to the Foundation board of directors." "Thank you is not enough," she said.

The Society is proud to announce the hiring of **Aley Philp** who will begin working with Linda early in August, and officially take over as Executive Director on October 1st.

Aley was among thirteen applicants who applied for the position of Executive Director, and is looking forward to meeting many of you at the Annual Meeting in Cody the weekend of September 8th.

A native of Thermopolis, Aley went on to attend the University of Wyoming graduating with a Bachelor of Science in Marketing with minors in Graphic Design, Economics, and International Business. She currently owns and operates her own business, PH Consulting, LLC in Wheatland. Aley has a strong career working with nonprofits, program and campaign development, fundraising, and community and state advocacy. She has been instrumental in coordinating well-done fundraising efforts, including "An Evening in Italy," an event for St. Patrick's Catholic Church and the annual Blue Mountain Car Show with the Wheatland Kiwanis Club. Aley has the qualifications, skills, and passion to help the Society meet its goals for many years to come. She said, "I look forward to meeting with chapters, and members, and welcome any invitation to attend meetings to discover ways to help. I want to make the Society's voice unique and enticing to revitalize and grow our chapters — both a fantastic challenge and a goal."



Aley and her 9-year old son, Johnny, live in Wheatland where he attends fourth grade at Libby Elementary. Her late father, Frank Philp, was a State Legislator from 1993 to 2010; Aley's mom, Janet, lives in Thermopolis and is a retired educator.
