This property involves a home built in Encampment during the boom year of 1903. The Walters family undertook the significant task of restoring it to its former early 20th Century grandeur. During the work on the home, many small treasurers were uncovered including small toy cars and soldiers. The Walters left small treasurers for future owners to uncover if the walls are opened again. Items left included current newspapers and coin money of various denominations.
