The Wyoming State Historical Society recognizes individuals and organizations in the field of Wyoming history by an annual awards program. The awards are presented each year at the annual meeting of the Society on the Saturday following Labor Day; this year the convention was hosted by the Campbell County Historical Society in Gillette. Nominations are submitted through the local and county chapters of the Society, individuals who are members of the Society may also make nominations, and self-nominations are encouraged.

The Society seeks nominations that reflect outstanding work in preserving and interpreting Wyoming history. Awards are divided into seven main category groups.
